Trend Analysis of Corruption Indictment

The rate of corruption indictment per 100,000 people

Based on the number of corruption cases on which charges were filed by district prosecutors offices after investigations were concluded, and changes in the percentage of persons indicted for corruption in the average population, the rate of corruption indictment per 100,000 people in 2002 was 4.8 (unit: person(s)/100,000 people, meaning that for every 100,000 people, 4.8 persons are indicted for corruption). The rate peaked at 6.4 in 2008 and has continued to be on the decline over the years, and ended 3.4 in 2023. Observation will continue with respect to future data.
